- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "United Nations
- 5 Human Rights Council Reform Act".

1	SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON VOLUNTARY AND ASSESSED CON-
2	TRIBUTIONS TO UNITED NATIONS COMMIS-
3	SIONS OF INQUIRIES THAT RELATE TO
4	ISRAEL.
5	The United States may not make any voluntary or
6	assessed contributions to United Nations Commissions of
7	Inquiries that relate to Israel as mandated by the United
8	Nations Human Rights Council.
9	SEC. 3. ACTIONS RELATING TO UNITED NATIONS HUMAN
10	RIGHTS COUNCIL.
11	(a) In General.—The Secretary of State shall take
12	such actions as may be necessary to use the voice, vote,
13	and influence of the United States in the United Nations
14	Human Rights Council and the United Nations General
15	Assembly to seek to—
16	(1) eliminate Agenda Item 7 of the Human
17	Rights Council;
18	(2) eliminate secret-ballot elections for member-
19	ship to the Human Rights Council; and
20	(3) institute baseline criteria for membership in
21	the Human Rights Council.
22	(b) Report.—Not later than 90 days after the date
23	of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the
24	President shall submit to the appropriate congressional
25	committees a report on the implementation of the actions
26	described in subsection (a).

1	SEC. 4. CONGRESSIONAL BRIEFING RELATING TO UNITED
2	NATIONS HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL.
3	Not later than 30 days before the start of each ses-
4	sion of the United Nations Human Rights Council, the
5	Secretary of State shall provide to the appropriate con-
6	gressional committees a briefing on—
7	(1) the session agenda of the Human Rights
8	Council; and
9	(2) reports, appointments of mandate holders of
10	special procedures and expert mechanisms, and ac-
11	creditation requests relating to the Human Rights
12	Council.
13	SEC. 5. REPORT.
14	The Secretary of State shall submit to the appro-
15	priate congressional committees, on an annual basis, a re-
16	port on—
17	(1) each vote related to Israel and Palestinian
18	territories taken by the United Nations Human
19	Rights Council in the preceding calendar year, indi-
20	cating—
21	(A) the agenda item under which the vote
22	was taken; and
23	(B) how each member state of the Human
24	Rights Council voted; and
25	(2) the amount of bilateral United States for-
26	eign assistance, by account and program area, pro-

1	vided under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 to
2	each member state of the United Nations Human
3	Rights Council in the preceding calendar year.
4	SEC. 6. APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
5	FINED.
6	In this Act, the term "appropriate congressional com-
7	mittees" means—
8	(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the
9	Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-
10	resentatives; and
11	(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
12	the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate.
